This year we developed new and stronger partnerships, piloted new curriculum and hosted our first two in-person courses since 2020.

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




2022 Highlight: Student Metrics

We hosted 220 students in 11 full courses: eight Level I, one Level II and two Multifamily Pilots. Most students work in the Midwest though the Level II course included a few individuals from other US states. Nearly three quarters of the students who attended a course this year earned a Training Certificate of Completion (TCOC) and an additional 10 students from previous years finished their coursework and earned the TCOC this year. Of the students in the 2022 courses, the most came from the multifamily residential, education and government sectors.

Additionally, we continued to offer Continuing Education Unit (CEU) opportunities for our graduates. We offered multiple two-day (six hours total) courses that pulled directly from the BOC curriculum and were taught by our own BOC instructors. We also hosted several one-hour webinars that focused on topics ranging from new energy efficiency technology to indoor air quality and safety, which were taught by various partners. 2022 Highlight: BOC Level I Multifamily Pilots

In 2022, MEEA invested in the development of a new curriculum, BOC Level I Multifamily, that builds off the existing BOC Level I curriculum with a focus on equipment and challenges commonly encountered in multifamily buildings. We hosted two pilot courses during 2022, one online and one in-person in Okemos, MI, that together trained 60 students. The extensive feedback collected from the students, instructors and coordinators during these pilot classes, plus another pilot hosted by a different BOC administrator, will inform final modifications to the curriculum. We anticipate the curriculum will be finalized and offered again in 2024. Visit boccentral.org/multifamily for more information.

A few state highlights:


- Illinois: In partnership with Ameren, ComEd, Nicor Gas, Peoples Gas and North Shore Gas, we hosted two courses specifically for students in Illinois, including one in-person course hosted in Chicago.
- Michigan: Consumers Energy sponsored our first, in-person BOC Level I Multifamily course and hosted it at their facility in Okemos, MI. They also sponsored several one-hour webinars and, together with DTE Energy, co-sponsored the two-day continuing education course we offered throughout the year.
- <u>lowa:</u> The Energy Association of lowa Schools piloted a Building Operator Pathway (BOP) course for high schoolers interested in careers in building operations.

Looking Ahead to 2023:


