Building Operator Certification experienced another successful year in 2019 thanks to our incredible partners, expert instructors and dedicated staff.

In 2019, MEEA was able to train a total of 324 building operators in 25 series across 10 states and expand the program's reach by engaging new stakeholders across the region.

The BOC program is offered throughout the United States and Canada, and BOC continues to expand nationally with the help of the numerous program implementers. At the end of 2019, there were more than 20,000 BOC professionals, many of whom continue their BOC education by maintaining their credential.

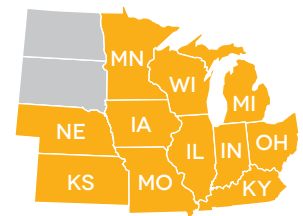

LOOKING AHEAD TO 2020

MEEA is excited to share all that we have planned for the year ahead, including 24 Level I series and 4 Level II series across 11 states. We're looking forward to hosting our first closed training of the year with the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction. MEEA is also bringing the training back to popular locations like Madison, WI and Perrysburg, OH for the first time since 2017. This year we will continue expanding our outreach and local partnerships in Missouri, Nebraska, Iowa, Indiana and Kentucky.

The outlook continues to be very positive in Illinois, Michigan, Minnesota, Wisconsin and Kansas thanks to strong, ongoing support from local partners there. Despite recent setbacks in energy efficiency legislation, demand for BOC in Ohio remains strong and MEEA is optimistic that BOC can continue to make an impact. NEBRASKA HIGHLIGHTS

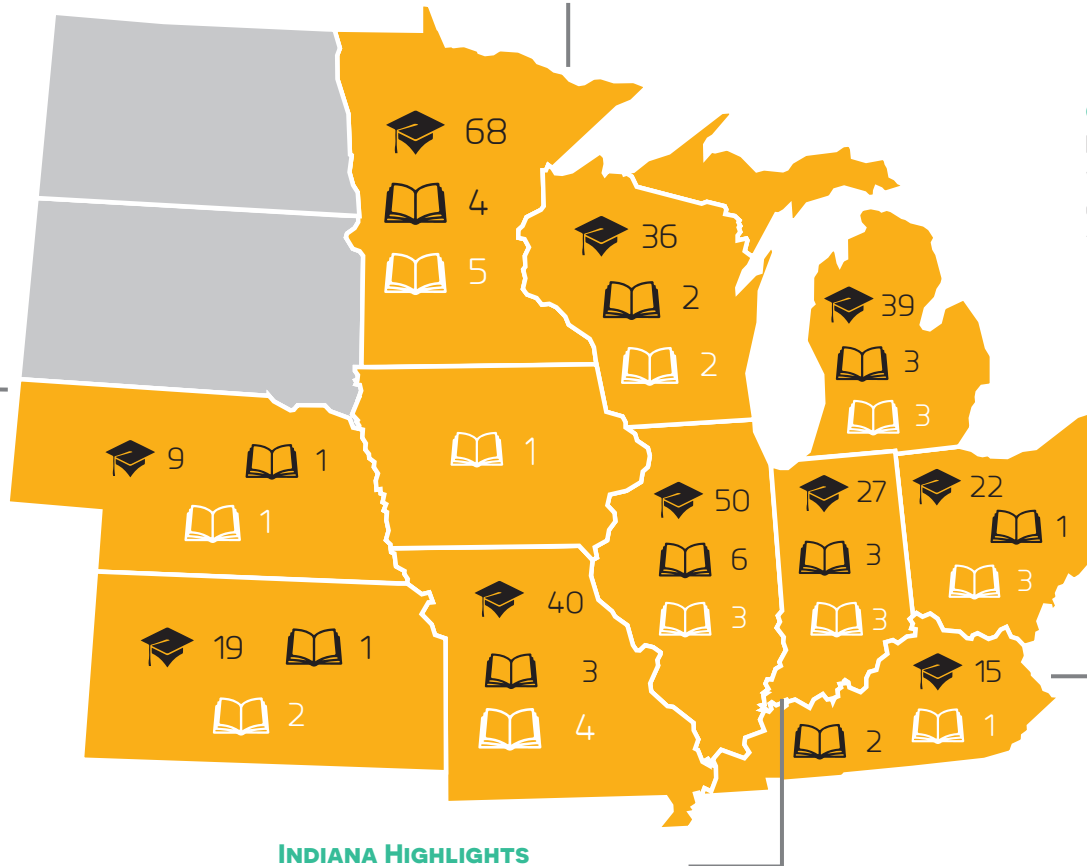
MEEA trained 9 state employees in Kearney, NE thanks to funding secured with the Nebraska Energy Office
